

# 'Storyboard That' Directions

1. Navigate to <https://www.storyboardthat.com/>
2. Have students choose the blue "log on" button in the upper right-hand corner.
3. Choose "new user".
4. Enter the information on the left-hand side. Write it down below so you don't forget it.

5. Once you log in, choose "create a storyboard".
6. Underneath the three cells that appear, hit the button called "add cells". Choose 3 x 2 and then "change layout".
7. Requirements for cells:

- ◆ Introduction to Mohenjo-Daro: Where? When? On what river?
- ◆ Homes
- ◆ Toilets, Shower Rooms, & Sanitation
- ◆ Great Bath and religious purification
- ◆ Use of seals
- ◆ Distant trade and trade products

8. Add a scene to each cell. Click on the tabs such as "historical" or "outdoor" and drag the scene to the cell. Required scenes:

- Brick homes under "US History"
- Boat under "US History" or "Historical"
- Swimming pool under "Classical Homes"

9. Once you have all of your scenes in place, hit "save and continue" at the bottom to save your work. Then continue working.

10. Add characters. Click on the "characters" tab and then choose characters that look Indian under the "cultural tab". To edit a character, click on it and change:

- Hair color – *think about what would be appropriate for Indian people*
- Skin color – *think about what would be appropriate for Indian people*
- Eye Color – *think about what would be appropriate for Indian people*
- Pose
- Emotions
- Actions

# 'Storyboard That' Directions (contd.)

11. You can also add animals under the "animal" tab in "characters". Think about what animals are native to ancient India and would be found in a city.

12. Add text by clicking on "textables". **You are required to have at least two facts in each cell.**

A. Use your "Mohenjo-Daro & Indus Civilization" Questions as a source of information.

B. For information about the Great Bath, go to <https://theancientinstitute.wordpress.com>. At the top click on Ancient India Links. Scroll down to the Indus River Valley Civilization and click on Water & Indian Religions.

C. To incorporate the facts, use:

- Signs – "signage" tab
- Text blocks – "classic tab"
- Speech or thoughts bubbles – "classic", "comic", or "artistic" tabs.

13. When re-entering StoryBoardThat:

- a. Enter your username/email and password
- b. Click on "My Account"
- c. Click on the image of your storyboard
- d. Scroll down and click "edit"

14. When finished, your teacher will explain how he/she wants you to share your work.
